

our strategic priorities



PRIORITY 1: advocacy

Provide successful advocacy efforts for each state.

Increased Government Funding

Develop annual advocacy priorities in alignment with local Ys to support increased government funding and decrease regulatory barriers for local Ys.

Advocacy Events

Host state advocacy days to allow priorities to be shared with elected officials and local Ys staff and volunteers to tell their "Y Story". Send strong delegations to National Advocacy Days including Alliance staff, local Y CEOs, volunteers, and youth advocates.

Lobbyist Connections

Organize lobbying efforts around priorities for Wisconsin and Minnesota and partner with Michigan for U.P. Michigan Ys.

Public Policy Resources

In partnership with Y-USA and lobbyist teams, provide local Y staff and volunteers education, training, and resources around advocacy and public policy.

Elected Official Support

Support local Ys in hosting elected officials to their Ys and or an event.

Collective Support

Pursue as a collective, support from for-profit businesses and purchasing agreements.

Data

Collect and provide summary of data to local Ys to share with local officials.

PRIORITY 2: operational support

Maximize the operational position of member Ys

Direct Service Support

In partnership with Y-USA, continue to provide direct support around: Strategic Planning, Board Governance, Collaboration/Partnerships, and CEO Search and Onboarding.

YMCA Network Connection

Provide project specific support using the YMCA Network: Mountain Midwest Hub, Service Delivery Ys, Y-USA, Alliance, and other Local YMCAs.

Staff Connections

Continue to support Peer Communities and annual events to provide networking and resource sharing opportunities for local Y staff and volunteers.

Operational Assessments

Provide operational assessments for local Ys to share insights and resources and improve overall performance of Ys.

Y Leader Networking

Support CEO and Y Leader networking through regular calls, gatherings, neighborhoods, information sharing, to promote sharing of best practices and innovative ideas.

PRIORITY 3: human capital

Maximize member Ys abilities to recruit, employ, and retain the most highly trained and capable staff.

Training Opportunities

Increase training opportunities for local Ys in partnership with Y-USA, Mountain Midwest Hub, and Service Delivery Partner Ys.

Shared Experiences

Support recruitment and retention efforts through information sharing/shared services model to promote greater awareness of employment opportunities and trends. Improve access to employment best practices.

Increase Trainers

Increase the overall number of trainer level staff throughout the Alliance through continued leadership development opportunities and communication tools.

Vendor Opportunities

Utilize the Alliance to broker vendor opportunities for local Ys that provide efficiencies in cost or additional revenue opportunities.

CEO and CVO Onboarding

Provide direct support to local Ys for CEO and CVO onboarding, training, retreats, and resource sharing.

Board Development

Support board development, connectivity, and engagement through retreats, quarterly virtual calls, conferences, and direct support from the Alliance.

PRIORITY 4: innovation

Support Ys in continued evolution of membership and programming models to meet community need.

Third Party Payor

Continue to develop opportunities for third party payor partnerships centered on membership and programs/services provided by local Ys.

Innovation Task Force

Develop an Innovation Task Force focused on identifying and implementing new strategies for local Ys to deliver impactful services to their communities.

Sharing Platform

Develop an internal sharing platform to allow local Ys to share innovative ideas and best practices for programs and services that could be duplicated at other Ys.

Shared Services

Continue to promote and educate local Ys on the value of shared services model and collaborative efforts. Assist interested YMCAs in seeking out shared service partners.

Alliance-Wide Partnerships

Identify potential Alliance-wide partnerships which will benefit all 50 Y associations in the Alliance.

Innovative Resources

Provide regular updates and speakers focused on new and innovative ideas and opportunities for local Ys.
