#### OFF ALL 31 YMCA ASSOCIATIONS OFFER LICENSED CHILDCARE TO THEIR COMMUNITIES

Safe, accessible and affordable childcare will allow parents to return to or enter the workforce.

- \$3 million to support 6 weeks to 5 years of age Early Childhood Education
- \$3 million to support 4K to 12 years of age Out of School programming

CHILD SAFETY AND WELL-BEING IS OUR NUMBER ONE PRIORITY.

Nationally, nearly 35 million children have had at least one traumatic experience, and nearly two-thirds of children have been exposed to violence. Senior isolation has increased exponentially during the pandemic.

# REVISIONS TO CHILD CARE LICENSING



Updates to licensing requirements will assist Ys in hiring, training, and retaining dedicated and skilled staff. Expanding staff age range requirements will broaden our ability to hire a workforce able to

serve all children on waitlists. Approve the Department of Children and Families licensing rule revisions to be enacted in

2023
